Good morning:

Weather and air quality conditions permitting, fire crews will continue pile burning in locations throughout the Mammoth and Mono Lakes Ranger Districts. Project areas include near the June Lake Loop area and near Earthquake Fault along Hwy 203 in Mammoth Lakes. Smoke will be visible from multiple locations.

Thank you for your patience while this important work is completed. Smoke levels are monitored in partnership with state and local air quality regulatory agencies and the best days for smoke dispersal are used. Just as small fires prevent future big fires, so do small smoke events prevent future, bigger smoke events.

Every acre that burns under favorable conditions helps prevent the larger, unwanted fire and its smoke event.
